**Minutes
Special Called Council Meeting

The Governing Body of the City of Maud will hold a Special Called Council Meeting on April 24, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers located at 135 Main St., Maud, Texas, for consideration of the following agenda items:


1. Call meeting to order, roll call, establish a quorum.
The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm. All councilmembers were preset except Councilman Terry Martin and Councilwoman Debbie Mathis. A quorum was established.
2. Invocation and pledge of allegiance.
The Mayor called on City Secretary, Vicki May, to say the prayer. The council led the pledge.
3. Consider and take official action on approving the April 17, 2023 Meeting Minutes.
Motion by Councilman Robert Wells and 2nd by Councilman Wayne Foster to approve the minutes. Motion carried.
4. Discuss, and take official action, if any, with Texarkana Property Management on the violation of City Ordinance 2021-1018, the transporting and placement of two (2) mobile homes located in the Shady Acres Trailer Park, having the physical address of 420 Broadway, Maud Texas, 75567, without required permits and expressed permission of the City Council of the City of Maud.
No action taken on this item. Mayor Clary informed Kim Lee, with Texarkana Property Management that if any more mobile homes were transported, delivered or set-up at Shady Acres prior to permits being pulled the fine amount would be increased. She advised that she has relayed that message to the owner, Braden Dodson.
5. Consider and take official action approving the hiring of a full time Police Chief and amending the existing "Maud/Redwater Interlocal Agreement to Share a Police Officer" between the cities of Maud and Redwater.
After some discussion, the councilmembers present expressed what they expected from the police chief. All the councilmembers agreed that a strong presence on the streets of Maud was a priority. Councilman Sartin expressed that if the chief was called and a message was left on the recorder "a call back was a must" if only to let the caller know that their message was received. Councilman Wells expressed that the traffic speeding past his house on Broadway needed to be a top priority and citations need to be issued. Councilman Foster stated that the police vehicle needs to be moving and not sitting in the same spot for long periods of time so the criminal element would not know of his whereabouts and it might deter some crime. Mr Foster also had concerns that a house

down from his residence on Bowie Street was being used as a drug house. A motion by Councilman Boyd Sartin and a 2nd by Councilman Wayne Foster to approve the hiring of Jimmy Woolery as the full time Police Chief for the cities of Maud and Redwater. Motion carried.


6. Adjourn.
