Effective upon the approval of the "Uniform Rental Agreement", the City will continue to reimburse public works employees a maximum of \$300.00 per year, per employee, for the purchase of one (1) pair of "Steel Toe Work Boots". ***(Amended 1/24/2022)"

Proposed amendment to policy "The City will provide uniforms for the Chief of Police and work clothes for the Public Works employees. The city will provide 5 work shirts, with city logo, per employee. The city will reimburse public works employees a maximum of \$250.00 per year, per employee for the purchase of one (1) pair of "Steel Toe Work Boots". The city will issue \$150.00 per year, per employee for the purchase of work pants/jeans of the employees choice. The city will furnish, to each employee, 1-hi-visibility safety vest, 1 set of rain gear, including rubber boots, and 1 pair of chest waders.
